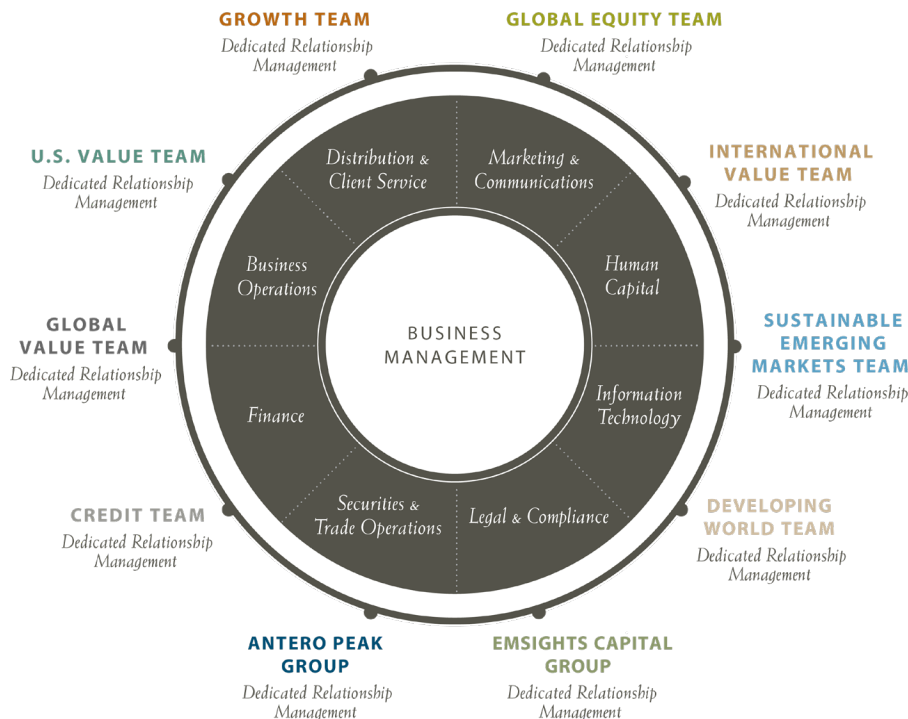

## Business Model

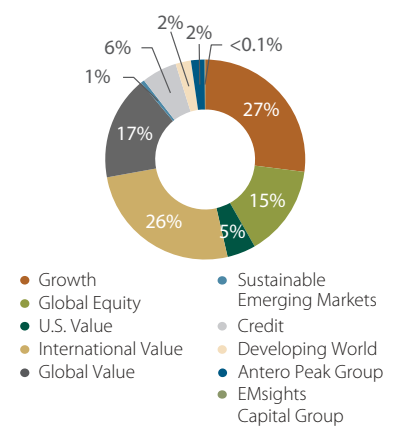

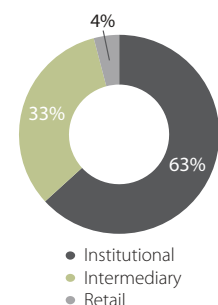
